TLEVELS



October (2nd – 6th) marked National T Level Week

Launched in September 2020, T Levels are 2-year courses which are taken after GCSEs and are broadly **equivalent to 3 A Levels**. They have been developed in collaboration with employers and education providers so that the content meets the needs of industry and prepares students for entry into **skilled employment**, an **apprenticeship or higher education**.

T Levels focuses on vocational skills. Students spend 80% of the course in their learning environment (college), gaining the skills that employers need. The other 20% is a **meaningful industry placement**, where they put these skills into action.

T Levels were **designed with leading businesses**, for example Lloyds Banking group, NHS, Nestlé, Yorkshire Water and Persimmon Homes, and are now supported by employers of all sizes to give students the workplace skills they need to succeed.

There are currently **over 20 T Level subjects** to choose from, including:
