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Aims and values

Key principles

- Fostering Restorative Practices: Embracing restorative approaches that prioritise repairing harm and rebuilding relationships as an effective way to resolve conflicts and address behavioural issues.
- Cultivating a Supportive Environment: Creating an environment where support and understanding are readily available for those who require guidance, ensuring that every individual feels supported and valued.
- **Continuous Reflection and Improvement**: Regularly reflecting on practices and behaviour strategies to continuously improve the school's approach to behaviour management, adapting to meet the evolving needs of the community.
- Inclusivity and Diversity: Celebrating and respecting diversity, ensuring that behaviour expectations and support systems are inclusive and sensitive to individual differences and cultural backgrounds.
- Encouraging Positive Relationships: Emphasising the significance of positive relationships between staff, students, and families, promoting open communication and collaboration to maintain a cohesive community.



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- Recognising Effort and Progress: Acknowledging and celebrating efforts made and progress achieved in behavioural improvement, reinforcing a positive cycle of encouragement and support.

- Empowering through Education: Providing education and resources not only for students but for staff and parents, empowering them with the tools and knowledge necessary to support positive behaviour.
- Encouraging Lifelong Skills: Instilling and reinforcing life skills such as conflict resolution, emotional regulation, and empathy, preparing students for responsible citizenship and success beyond the school environment.
