


- Pupils will undertake the AQA GCSE Art and Design (Fine Art) Course.
- This consists of two components:
 - Component 1: Portfolio
 - Component 2: Externally set assignment





Specification Information



- You will have three, one hour lessons per week.
- There will be 3 different coursework (Portfolio) projects that you will study over the two years (One of these is the mock exam project).
- The externally set assignment (final exam) is a project which consists of 7-8 weeks of preparation work, followed by a final piece which you can take up to 10 hours to complete.
- Any work completed in school or at home can count towards your coursework.
















Portfolio (Coursework)

Externally set assignment (Exam)





Coursework(60%) Marked out of 96

All work completed in year 10 and 11 (apart from the exam)

The Mock Exam is included as coursework **Exam (40%)** Project begins after Christmas in Year 11.

At the end of the project there is a timed exam. The whole project is marked out of 96







Fine art is all about your skill, creativity and imagination.

You will create work in response to project themes developing your own unique thoughts and ideas.





You will also investigate contemporary and historical artists.

You will be making connections with the work of these artists throughout your own work







From your research, you will begin to experiment with and explore the potential of different techniques, materials and processes.

This could include traditional fine art practice such as drawing and painting. However, you will also be encouraged to experiment with techniques such as printmaking, photography, digital art and mixed media that could all become part of your work.









The work that you build up will form the basis for a final piece that sums up your project. This will assess your ability to bring all your thoughts together and express your ideas in

response to the original starting point or project theme.





How you will be assessed/question types/skills

• There are four assessment objectives.

AO1: Develop ideas through investigations, demonstrating critical understanding of sources.

AO2: Refine work by exploring ideas, selecting and experimenting with appropriate media, materials, techniques and processes.

AO₃: Record ideas, observations and insights relevant to intentions as work progresses.

AO₄: Present a personal and meaningful response that realises intentions and demonstrates understanding of visual language.





There are 24 marks available for each assessment objective

 AO1: Artists, Art styles, investigations, initial sketches (24 marks)

- AO2: Developing your ideas, experimenting with media and techniques. Refining your work (24 marks)
- AO3: Drawing from images, collecting resources, taking photographs, annotating your work (24 marks)

 AO4: Making your work meaningful and personal. Taking your idea through to its conclusion. (24 marks)





The GCSE Art Project – A Step by Step Guide

Step 1

What are the basic elements of the project? Eg: Natural Forms would be Leaves, Stones, <u>Shells</u> etc

Make detailed and accurate drawings of these in a variety of media. Annotate your drawings describing how you've made them and how you can improve them (AO2)(AO3)





Step 2

Who are the artists who have produced work about this subject?

Make copies of their work and produce information pages about them and the style of art in which they work.

Write about how the Artist inspires and influences your own work (AO1)





Step 3

Start to Create and Design your own ideas.

Use your drawings, take photographs, and source pictures from the internet

Develop and refine these ideas trying different styles, colour schemes, media, backgrounds, shapes and sizes etc

Annotate your work, explaining what you've done and how you plan to improve your ideas (AO1)(AO2) (AO3)



Step 4

Make a final piece that brings together your ideas and shows some influence of the artists and art styles you have looked at.

This should be your best piece of work and should take up to 10 hours to complete (AO4)

THE SUBJECT MATTER (THE THINGS YOUR WORK IS ABOUT – DRAWINGS, PHOTOGRAPHS ETC)


 + AN ARTISTIC STYLE (ARTIST INFLUENCE CLEAR TO SEE IN YOUR WORK)
+ EXPERIMENTATION WITH DIFFERENT MEDIA
+ YOUR CREATIVE IDEAS (SKETCHING, DEVELOPING AND REFINING YOUR COMPOSITION)

= THE FINAL PIECE

Careers/Next steps

- Art and Design can lead to jobs in Creative industries
